Part A: Pupil Premium Strategy Plan

Statement of intent:

The main barriers to learning for this cohort of children were limited acquisition of communication skills, low levels of self-regulation and a limited range of life experiences. We have used the additional Pupil Premium funding to contribute towards professional learning of staff through Educational Psychology service organisational package; towards the purchase of SLT based in school; towards the commissioning of a wellbeing coach and a play therapist. PP contributes towards a pastoral team to support in an outreach offer to support behaviour and attendance. We have also commissioned an EP to support with emotionally based non school attendance and also to support transition to Reception.
